Neil Saker is the IMF Resident Representative in Mongolia. He has worked at the IMF for over 16 years covering a wide range of countries and issues. Before coming to Mongolia, he was based at the IMF's Headquarters in Washington D.C. where he was the mission chief to Timor-Leste. During 2001 - 2004, he lectured at the IMF - Singapore Training Institute in Singapore where helped to train Asian officials in macroeconomic and financial sector issues. Prior to joining the IMF, he was a Director and Head of Asian Economic Research at Societe Generale Investment Bank, based in Singapore and has worked at the Bank of England as an international economist.
